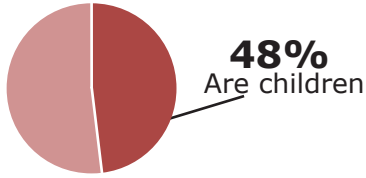




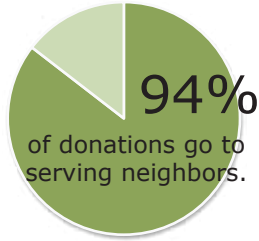

\$1 = 3 Meals

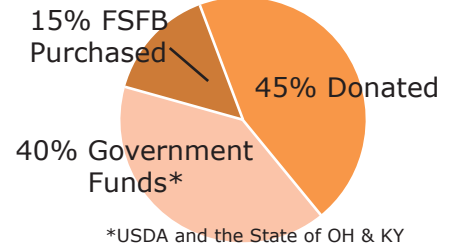
* Current conversion of lbs to meals is 1.2 lbs = 1 meal

A community farm where fresh produce is harvested to benefit local food pantries and on-site feeding organizations.

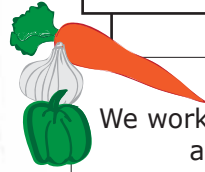

The Food Room

- Serves 200 Clients daily
- Average frequency of client visits: once every 30 Days
- 2012: Provided 2 million meals, feeding 150,000 people.



Central Parkway: Administration Offices & Cincinnati Cooks

- 105 Graduates per year
- 83% are working 1 year after graduation
- 4,550 meals prepared per week

Rosenthal Fresh Foods Initiative:

We work with local grocers and retailers to collect quality meat, deli, and produce that would otherwise end up in the trash.



Customer Connection Center Services Include...

- 900 people receiving help with managing finances through Protective Payee and Direct Rent.
- 3,100 people receiving emergency clothing through Back on Track
- Helping our clients secure IDs and Birth Certificates
- 13,700 Bus tokens handed out for job search, new employment, or medical treatment
- 5,400 direct referrals for services that promote stability.
- 1,000 receiving assistance with SNAP/Medicaid or income tax assistance
- \$24,000 in St. Vincent De Paul Society Clothing Vouchers for 1,200 people

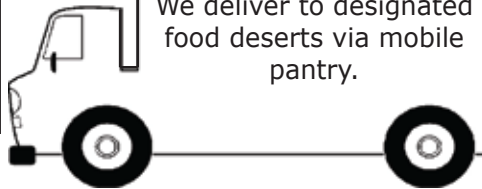

Power Pack Program

- 92 schools participate
- 4,000 packs assembled weekly during the academic year
- Each Power Pack costs \$4 a pack
